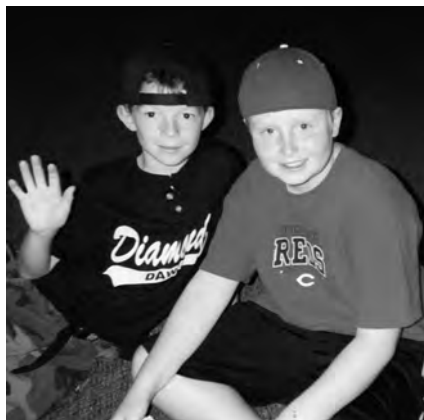

INFORMATION

Davidson Academy's 29th year of Bear Country Day Camp will begin, Monday, June 7 and continue thru Friday, July 30, 2010.

ENROLLMENT-All programs are filled on a first-come-first-served basis.

FEES-Total fees are due at the time of registration. You will be notified that your child's name has been placed on a waiting list if the camp is full.

DAY CAMP FEES-There is a **non-refundable** \$145 activity fee and a \$65 registration/supply fee per camper. Full-time fees are \$130 per week for DA students, \$155 per week for non-DA students. Charges begin June 7th and continue through July 30th.

.Full-time campers are allowed one week without charge for vacation use. Part-time fees are \$35 per day for DA students or \$40 per day for non-DA students. Part-time campers must specify the number of days per week the camper will be attending.
