Davidson Academy's 29th year of Bear Country Camp will begin, Monday, June 1 and continue thru Friday, July 31, 2009.

ENROLLMENT-All programs are filled on a first-come-first-served basis.

FEES-Total fees are due at the time of registration. You will be notified that your child's name has been placed on a waiting list if the camp is full.

DAY CAMP FEES-There is a **non-refundable** \$135 activity fee and a \$65 registration/supply fee per camper. Full-time fees are \$120 per week for DA students, \$135 per week for non-DA students. Charges begin June 1st and continue through July 31st.

Full-time campers are allowed one week without charge for vacation use. Part-time fees are \$30 per day for DA students or \$33 per day for non-DA students. Part-time campers must specify the number of days per week the camper will be attending. Specific days (Monday, Tuesdays, etc.) would be helpful, if possible. **A late fee of \$3.00 per minute per child is charged after 6:00 p.m.**
